

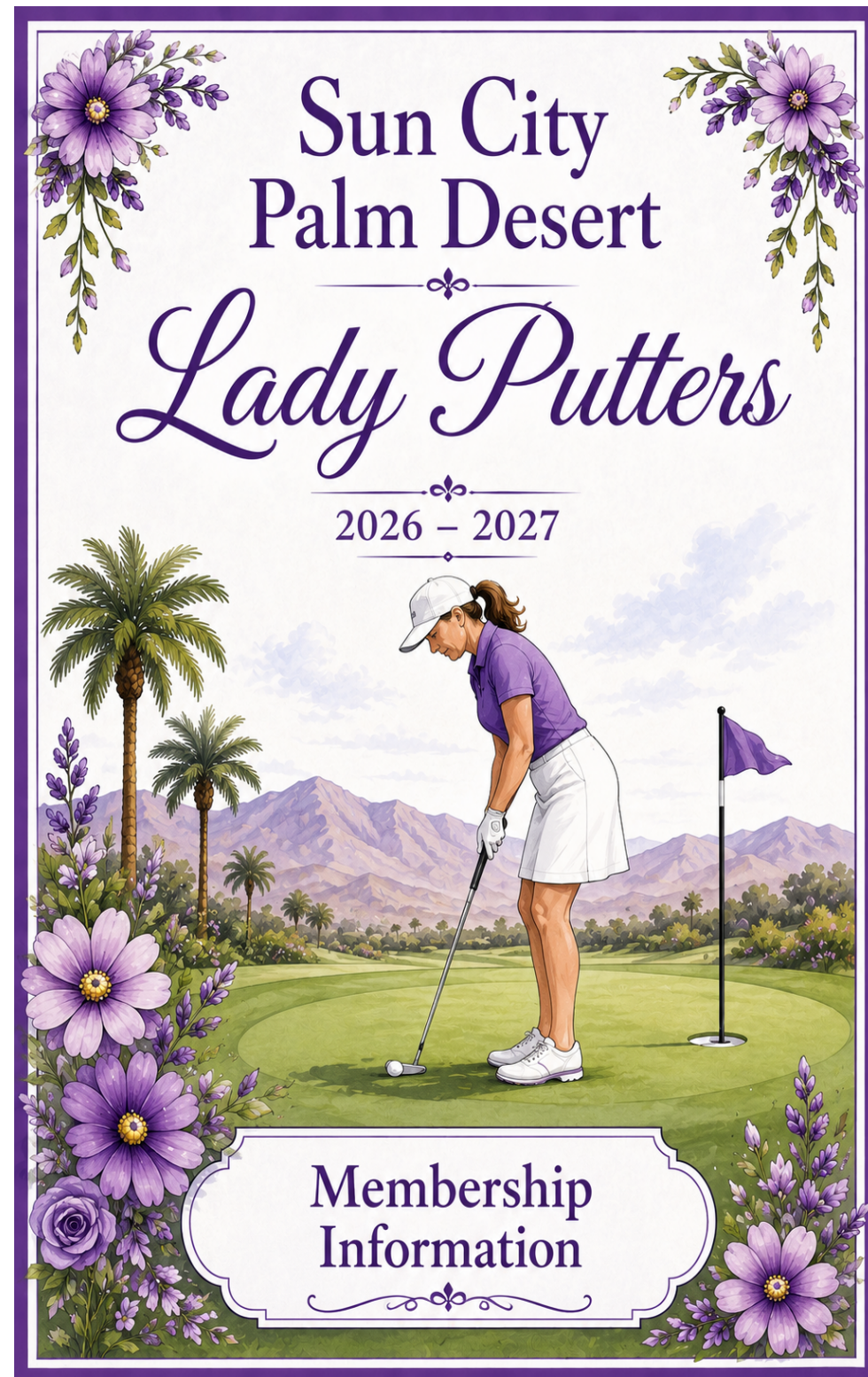

8. If your ball strikes another player's ball at rest, return your ball to where it was. **Penalty: 1 Stroke.** The ball at rest is replaced as near as possible to the original spot and putted to the hole.
9. If two balls are in motion & strike each other, both players should replay their balls from the original spot. **No Penalty.**
10. If a player putts to a hole before the previous player has finished the hole, the ball is returned to the tee. **Penalty: 1 Stroke.**
11. If a player putts to the wrong hole & continues to putt the ball into the hole. **Penalty: 1 Stroke.** If it is possible to putt to the correct hole from where the ball lies, you may count all strokes & eliminate the penalty.
12. If a ball is stopped or deflected by any moving or stationary object. **No Penalty.** The stroke is cancelled & the ball shall be replayed from the original spot.
13. If a ball hovers over the hole, wait for a count of 10, then strike the ball & count the stroke. No player shall take any action to influence the ball to drop into the hole. **Penalty: disqualification.**
14. Upon completion of a hole, players are to carry the ball, not strike it or push it with the putter head to the next hole. This will be deemed "testing the surface" or a practice stroke. **Penalty: 1 Stroke.**
15. The partner with the lowest number of strokes on a hole has the honor of teeing off first on the next hole.
16. A player may have a maximum of **6 strokes** on any one hole.

What else should I know? THE RULES

1. No practice putting is allowed on any putting green the day of competition.
2. After placing your ball at the tee marker, no practice stroke with the putter or sighting or crouching behind the ball is allowed. Penalty: 1 Stroke.
3. Please be aware of the following: a) stand well off the green while waiting; b) keep conversation to a minimum, cell phones off; c) move quickly to the next hole.
4. Mark your partner's score & your score at the completion of each hole. After completing 18 holes check your scores for each nine with your partner. Sign your card & attest the final score by signing your partner's card on the "attest" line. Both scorecards will be rejected if there is an error. Return both cards to the Scoring Committee.
5. Start all putts from the left side of the tee marker. (Left-handed putters place the ball on the right side of the marker). Place your ball on the ground. Do not drop it. Putt to the hole with the pin in the hole. Remove your ball from the hole by lifting up the pin. Do not place your hand or a ball retriever in the hole while the pin is in place. Replace the pin with the number facing the proper tee marker.
6. Continuous putting is the order of play; complete your putts before your partner tees off. Putt all putts; there are no "gimmees."
7. A ball putt off the green is deemed out of bounds. Bring the ball in a straight line back to the edge of the green; then measure one putter head & place the ball at the end of the putter. Penalty: 1 Stroke. However, if any portion of the ball is touching the clipped portion of the green, putt the ball from the position where it lies. **No Penalty.**

What awards are recognized?

Hole-In-One: Recognition will be given to any player who has a Hole-In-One. The Hole-In-One must be attested to on the scorecard by circling that hole.

Special Play Day:

- Mystery Holes: Winning holes are drawn at random. **Five-dollar** payout for each Hole-In-One on those holes only.
- Random "FUN": Announced prior to Putting day, example: \$\$ on the Flag, first person to Hole-In-One on a money hole wins!

END OF SEASON AWARDS:

- Perfect Attendance: End of season award to the person(s) who have not missed a Putting Day.
- Most Hole-In-Ones in one day
- Most Hole-In-Ones for the season
- Flights 1, 2, 3, 4
- Club Champion



What is the maximum number of times I can hit the ball?

We allow a maximum of six strokes per hole.

Where do we put our scorecards?

Each player will have a scorecard to record both yours and your partner's score. Both cards MUST be signed by both players verifying that the scores are correct and match. Bring your scorecards to the Payout table. If you have no Holes-In-Ones, place both of your scorecards in the NO Holes box. If either player has a Hole-In-One, present your completed scorecards to the Payout ladies. They will pay \$2 for every Hole-In-One and will place your scorecard in the Hole-In-One box.

When do we have luncheons?

Almost every month during the season there is a luncheon following putting on the third Wednesday. In December there is a Holiday Party and in April and May there is a brunch. Check the Putters website to see the menus and sign-up deadlines.

Flyers for lunch sign-ups/reservations will be posted on the website and available at the Putting Course.

If you pay for lunch and are unable to attend, there will be **no refund** as the club will be charged for your lunch. If play is cancelled due to inclement weather on a Wednesday luncheon day, the luncheon will still be held.
